Past Event - Atlantic Charter Plaque Unveiling – August 14,

Organized by The Atlantic Charter Foundation, with the participation of Our Society, the Churchill Society for the Advancement of Parliamentary Democracy, and the NATO Association of Canada.

Through the generosity of Society “Friends,” Jocelyn and Ed. Badovinac, a plaque has been placed in Nathan Phillips Square, Toronto, to accompany the four already installed back in 2004.

This recognizes the significance of the meeting between Winston Churchill and United States President Franklin Roosevelt in August 1941. On the 76th anniversary of the Conference, the formal unveiling was performed by the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario, Civic dignitaries, representatives of the United States and British governments, and Ed and Jocelyn Badovinac. Some ninety attendees later dined at the Royal Canadian Military Institute.

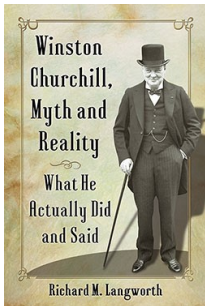

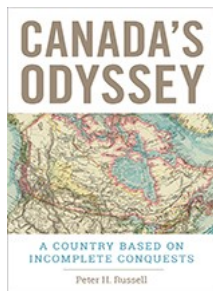

Richard Langworth was the founder of the International Churchill Society and for most of its existence the Editor of the *Finest Hour* magazine. In the Preface to his new book, he states that for more than fifty years he has spent a good deal of time puncturing, “myths, fables and things that go bump in the night!”
